## **Course Requirements**

- Complete 3 internship hours for every credit per week (12 hours a week). Make sure you include holidays, sick days and other interruptions in the schedule when planning the number of hours you will complete each week. For 4 credit hours, you need a minimum of 180 hours (minimum of 100 direct contact hours).
- Report any problems with your placement immediately!
- Document hours on form provided – have supervisor sign at the end of the internship.

**Due the last day of classes, May 4, 2007.**

- Request an evaluation of your performance from the off-site supervisor and review this with him/her. **Due the last day of classes May 4, 2007.**
- Contribute to the online discussion once a week. Topics will be posted at the beginning of each month.
- Choose 3 articles related to your internship placement (disabilities, intervention strategies, etc.) You must choose research articles that are from peer-reviewed journals. Write a 1-page summary of the article. **All article summaries due March 16, 2006.**
- Final essay. Write a four to five page paper about your experiences on your internship. Include the following components: 1. Describe your internship placement; 2. Choose one child to do a Case Study – diagnosis, long term communication goals, short term communication objectives, activities you used in intervention, the child's skills at the beginning of the semester and then at the end of the semester, strategies that facilitated learning; 3. Describe three skills you have learned during your internship. **Due on Monday, May 7, 2007.**
